2011 NCAA DIVISION III MEN'S TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS SELECTIONS

INDIANAPOLIS---The NCAA Division III Men's Tennis Committee has selected the individuals that will compete in the singles and doubles competition of the 2011 NCAA Division III Championships.

The individual championships shall consist of 32 singles players and 16 doubles teams. The selection of teams and individuals for the championships is based on won-lost record, strength of schedule and eligibility and availability of student-athletes.

The team championship will be held May 24-26, and the singles and doubles championships will be held May 27-29. The finals will be held at Claremont-Mudd-Scripps and Pomona-Pitzer Colleges.
